# The beginning.....

- A voluntary\* Community Development initiative by LIC of India as a responsible Corporate Citizen for fulfilling its social responsibilities from time to time.

(\* LIC does not come under the purview of Corporate Social Responsibility as per the Indian Companies Act, 2013, even after the recent amendments to the LIC Act, 1956)

- Established in 2006, to commemorate Golden Jubilee Year of LIC of India
- The Foundation is a Public Charitable Trust registered with the Charity Commission under Bombay Public Trust Act 1950
- LIC is the sole contributor to the Corpus of the Foundation. Contribution is received once every year from LIC. The Corpus is invested by GJF and only the interest income thereof is used for the charitable activities of GJF. Income of the Trust is exempt from Income Tax provided 85% of the income in a fiscal is spent on charitable activities.

# Governance

Trust Deed, LIC Golden Jubilee Foundation Rules and Regulations 2007 administer the affairs of the Trust. The Trust is governed by the Board of Trustees and an Executive Committee formed by the Board of Trustees.

## Board of Trustees

- Chairman - The Chairperson of Life Insurance Corporation of India shall be the Ex- officio Chairman of the Trust
- Members - Managing Directors of LIC of India and two outside members are the trustees of the Trust. Outside Members shall be on the Board for 2 years
- Function - The Trustees shall ordinarily transact their business in a duly invited and assembled meeting which should take place at least once during every six months. Three Trustees shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Trustees. Policy decisions, approval of Yearly Accounts, approval of Schemes and Projects beyond the power of the Executive Committee are considered by the Board of Trustees.

## Executive Committee

- Members - Three Managing Directors shall be the members of LIC GJF out of whom the Senior Most Managing Director shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee. Other MD shall be a Special Invitee.
- Function - Executive Committee will hold its meeting at least once in every quarter. Presence of three members in person shall form the quorum of the Executive Committee. Sanction of GJF Projects within its financial limits of Rs. 50 lakhs, recommend to the Board Projects above financial limits, Policy Decisions and other important matters of the Trust are discussed by EC.



## GJF Project Guidelines

### Criteria for NGOs seeking funding from GJF :

GJF projects are considered through Non-Govt. Organisations (NGOs). These organisations should be registered for at least 3 years, reputed and engaged in charitable activities.

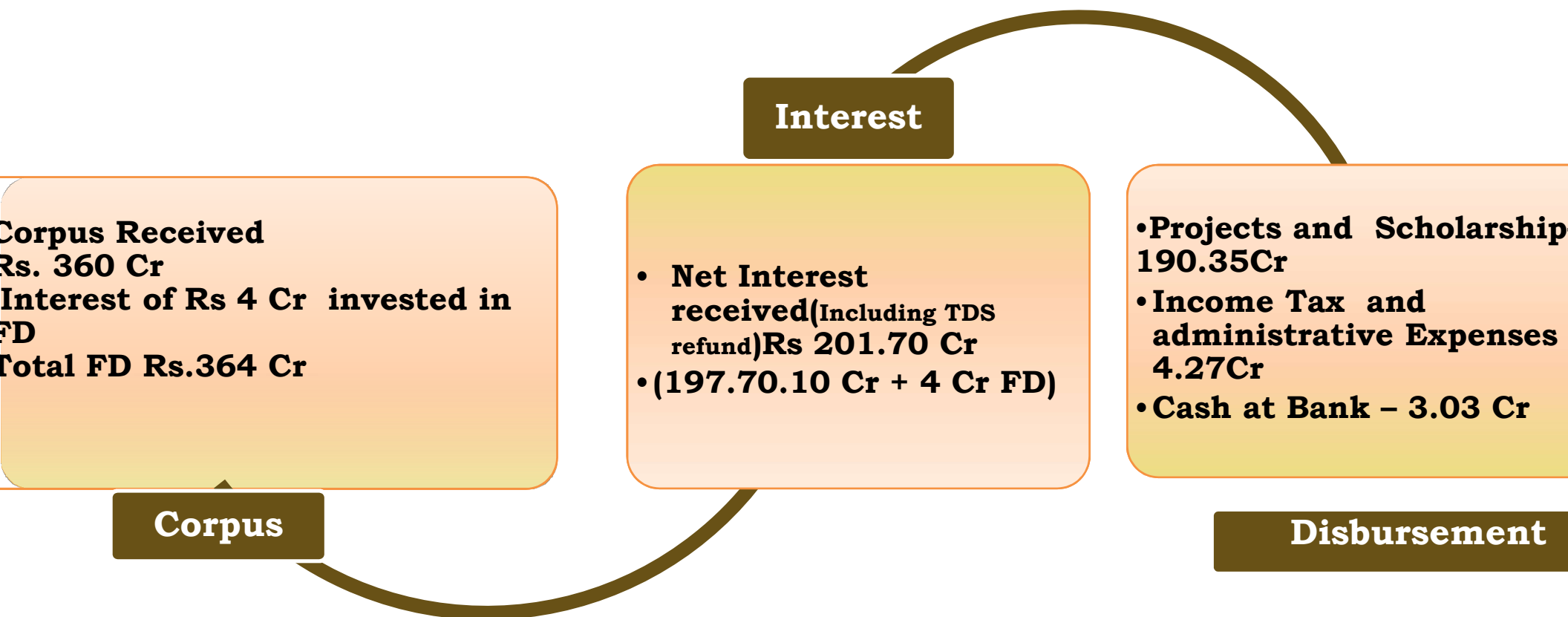
Should have certificate from Income Tax under Sec.80 G(5) and Sec.12 of IT Act 1961. Revised Guidelines issued in Budget 2021, that the NGOs has to apply for fresh registration for 80 G & 12 A after every 5 years.

The application has to be routed through the LIC Divisional Office, under whose territorial jurisdiction the project falls and then through the concerned Zonal Office.

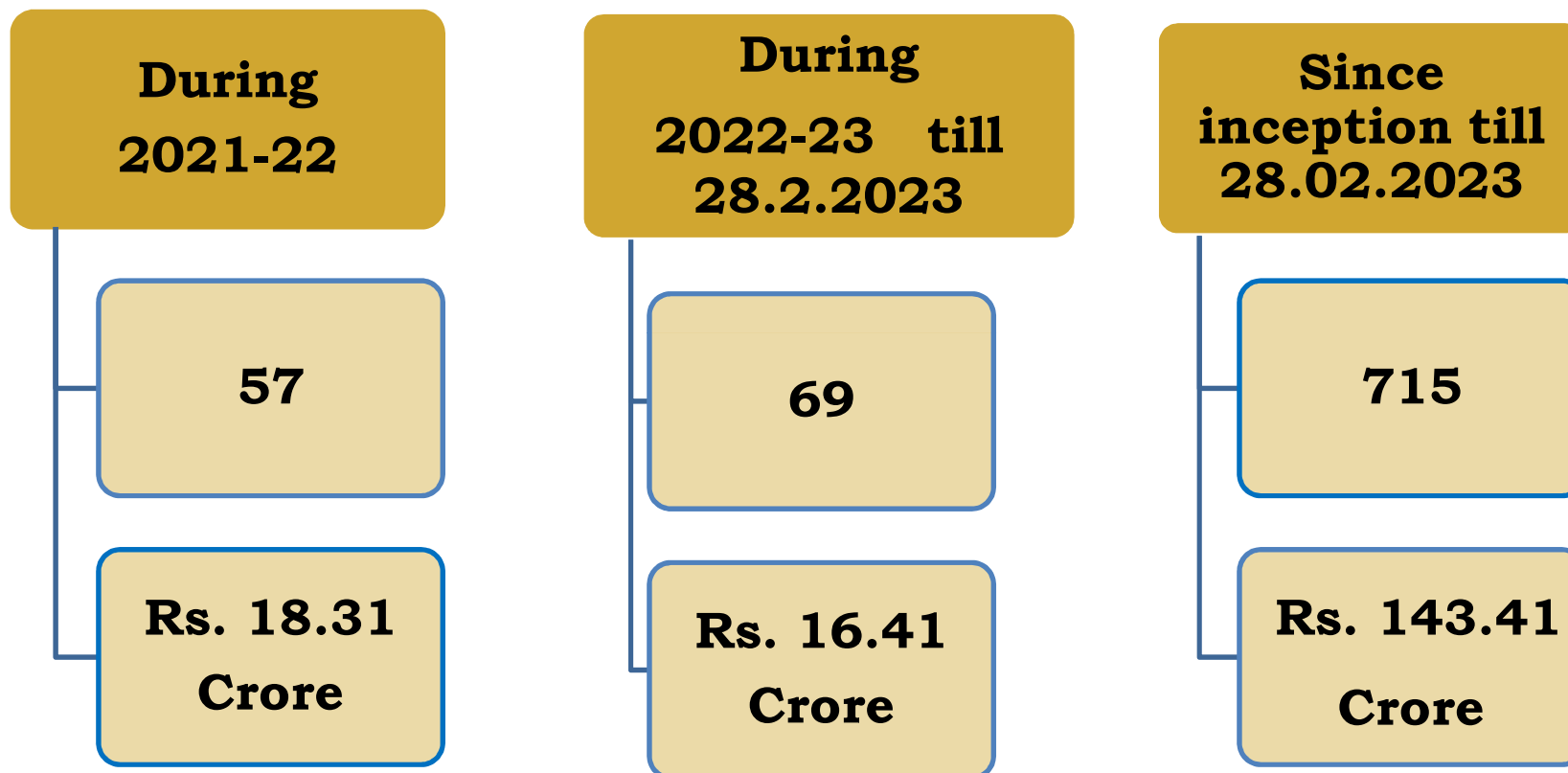


# Corpus & Investment

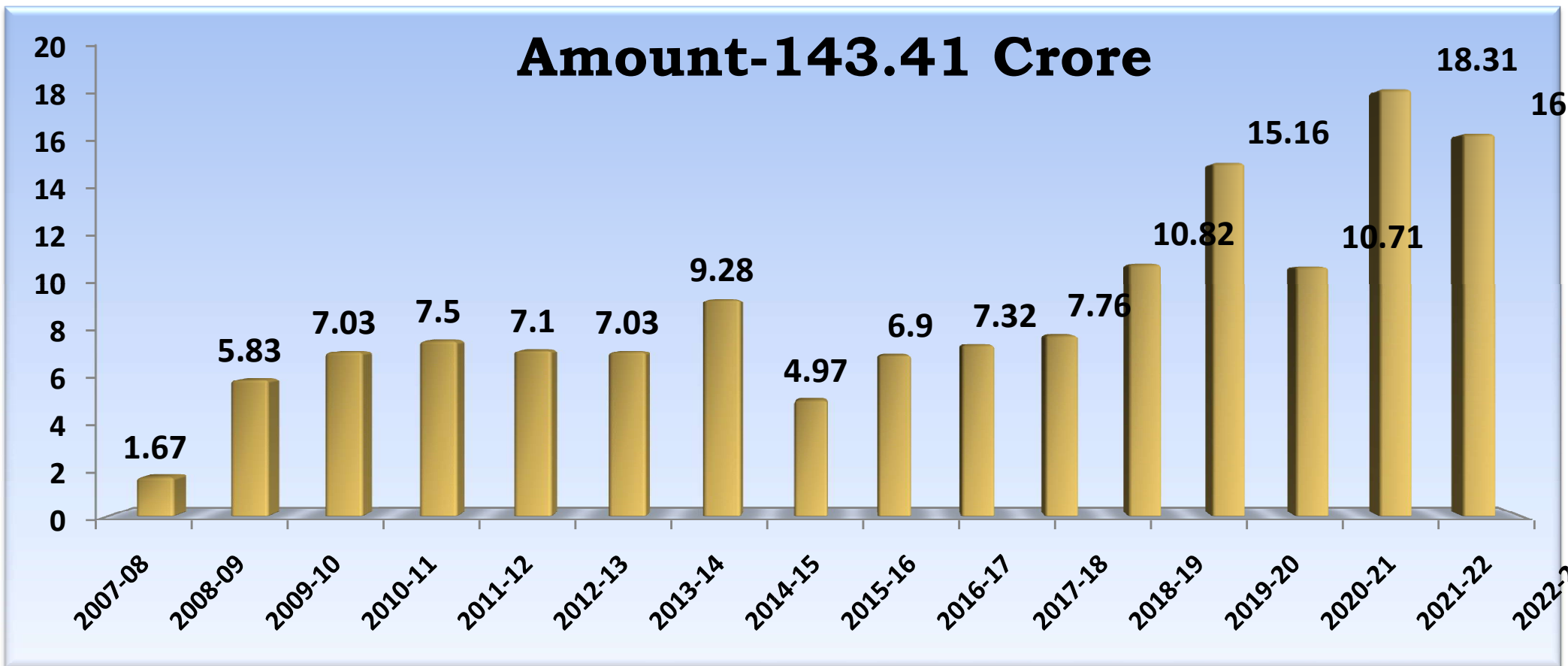

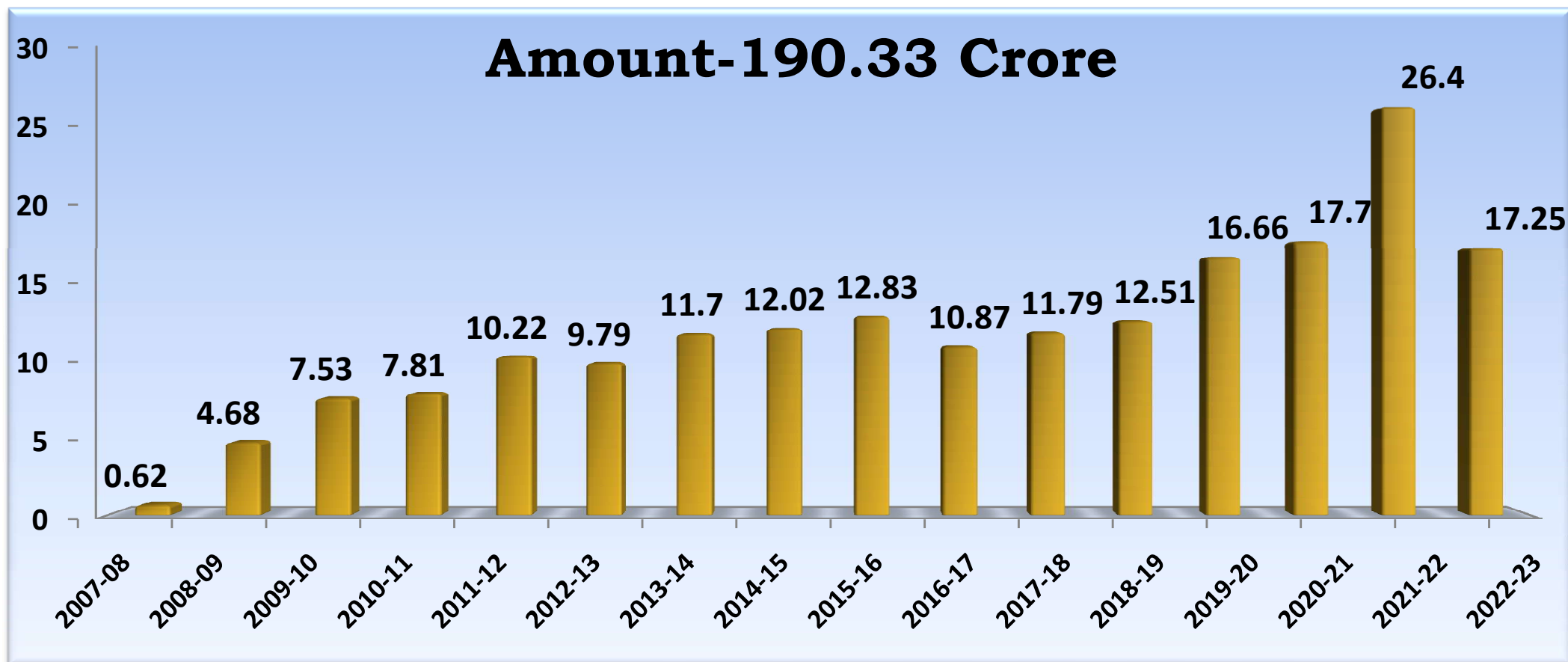

## Maharashtra Mandal –Raipur DO – Central Zone (2019-20)



Maharashtra Mandal Raipur is established in 1931. For the last 88 years, it has been relentlessly working for providing priority services in area of “Education and Health Care.” They are running two High Secondary Schools. Another project is house for physically challenged girls. It is totally free of residential program for girls from age 4 years above. They are also running Divyang Balika Vastu Grih, Hostel for working women and students, community mess, cultural activities, social services in Ramkund Area (Slum Area).

Financial Assistance of Rs 25,00,000/- has been provided for Construction of Physiotherapy Centre for poor & under privileged population of Chhattisgarh. The Centre would provide all the physiotherapy services at a very low cost which are otherwise unaffordable to common man.



## Indian Association of Blood Cancer & Allied Diseases KMDO 1 Eastern Zone (2022-23)



The Indian Association of Blood Cancer & Allied Diseases (IABCD) pays tribute and hope to people battling cancer and blood disorders. IABCD has more than 30 years of experience in serving critical care patients through blood banking and blood product research. All services are provided at subsidized rates and the poor and economically backward categories receive services free of cost.

Financial Assistance of Rs 9,67,883/- has been provided for Automated blood cell counter and mobile medical unit for promotion of voluntary blood donation and arranging medical camps for the economically backward sections of society





## World Renewal Spiritual Trust, Bhubaneswar DO - East Central Zone (2022-23)



The World Renewal Spiritual Trust was established to promote and carry out research in the ancient Indian Culture Yoga & Philosophies in close liaison with Prajapada Brahmakumaris Ishwariya Vishwavidyalaya. The Odisha branch constitutes of a classroom with audio visual facilities for sharing spiritual knowledge with 100 learners at a time along with an open auditorium to accommodate nearly 4000 participants for imparting spiritual view towards life promoting mental peace which is key to healthy mind. The organization, besides conducting the usual sessions for spiritual students, also conducts special counselling sessions for older adults who may have difficulty with the transitions of aging to manage their emotions, find new sources of enjoyment. They take efforts to help the elderly people to deal with frustrations and grief in life with equanimity as friends and family members pass on.

Financial Assistance of Rs 22,02,200/- has been provided for a School Bus (24 +D) seater for transportation of spiritual students from their homes to classroom and back.



## Sri Sri Rural Development Programme Trust, Karnal DO –North Zone (2022-23)



Sri Sri Rural Development Programme (SSRDP) under the aegis of Art of Living, Bengaluru was founded in 2001 with the single minded focus of empowering Rural India. The Ved Vignan Maha Vidhyapeeth in collaboration with SSRDP is conducting Skill Development & Entrepreneurship Programme and the goal of the project is to provide for skill development trainings.

Financial Assistance of Rs17,01,227/-has been provided for Setting up skill Development -Equipment for Tech Lab, Solar Lab & Toolkit for AC Repair for skill training of youth





## **Armed Force Flag Day Fund- Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi DO I –North Zone (2021-22))**



Kendriya Sainik Board, Ministry of Defence, Government of India, New Delhi was received contributing towards “Armed Force Flag Day Fund (AFFDF)”. The task of extending various welfare schemes to about 37 lakh ex- servicemen and their dependents is accomplished through 32 Rajya Sainik Boards at State/UT level and 403 District Sainik Boards. These welfare schemes for ex- servicemen, war widows, battle casualties, orphaned/ dependent children is funded by AFFDF. The nation needs to contribute towards the welfare and rehabilitation of the ex-servicemen community and Next of Kin of those killed/disabled in operations.

Contributed Rs 5 crores to Armed Force Flag Day Fund for welfare of Ex- Servicemen of the Indian Defence Force established by Kendriya Sainik Board for welfare of the veterans, widows and rehabilitation of ex-servicemen.



## Sulabh International Social Service Organization Varanasi DO-North Central Zone (2018-19)



Govindpur Village of Sonbhadra District, Myorpur Block was adopted by LIC GJF for providing assistance through Banwari Seva Ashram. Trust registered in the year 1956, established on Gandhian principles of life, which selflessly and untiringly works towards the upliftment of the villagers of Govindpur Panchayat Gambirpur covering the villages Govindpur and Gambirpur and surrounding predominantly tribal area. Govindpur Village has 101 households and Gambirpur village has 132 households and the total population of Gambirpur Panchayat is 1242 (ST-226, SC-801, OBC-175, Gen-40). They have provided an ambulance for medical relief and funds for a literacy campaign to eradicate illiteracy. Further, during the visit of GJF Officials in June 2018 and discussions with the Sarpanch and Villagers, the need for sanitation facilities was perceived. Sulabh International was consulted and looking at the terrain and scarcity of water, they suggested setting up two community toilets, with maintenance for 3 years.

Financial Assistance of Rs 76,22,984/- has been provided for the construction of two community toilet, (7 seated) with water tank in LIC's adopted village of Govindpur (major population SC/ST). Construction amount disbursed in instalments is completed in 2022-23.

The Malankara Orthodox Syrian Christian Church Mission submitted a proposal for grant of funds for purchase of two Dialysis Units for St. George Charitable Dialysis Centre. The Centre performs 4000 dialysis per year of which 80% is free of cost and the amount collected from other patients is insignificant in comparison to open market.

Financial Assistance of Rs 12,20,800/- has been provided for Two Dialysis Units at their dialysis centre for treatment of rural patients with renal failure.

They have conducted many programmes like eye operation, eye check up, dental check up, POCSO, Yoga, Scouts and Guides, Asha work shop, general health camps, Aids & cancer awareness, Tailoring training, health camps etc and about 10,940 people were benefited during 2017-2020

Financial Assistance of Rs 15,05,266/- has been provided for purchase of Bus ( 9+ D seater) for arranging health camps in deep rural area of Jagalur



## Gramin Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Kondgaon Kolhapur DO – Western Zone (2021-22)



Gramin Shikshan Prasark Mandal, Kondgaon Trust is providing education from kindergarten to Higher Secondary to the poor students living in the rural area of Ratnagiri. They have 249 students, 10 teachers and 3 non teaching staff. 230 students are coming from economic backward class (EBC), hence school is not charging any fee from the 230 Students. Trust has requested funds for construction of four class rooms at first floor of the existing building to start Junior College in the same premises

Financial Assistance of Rs 25,00,000/-has been provided for Construction of 4 classrooms at first floor of existing school building to start Junior College in the same premises at Ratnagiri.
